

Courses on Offer 2009/2010:

Foundation

The aim of the course is to equip learners with an introduction and overview of the Bible. The style and pace of learning works extremely well for new converts and those who want to know what the Bible is all about but can only commit to one year of study.

Certificate in Biblical Studies

The two-year Certificate course promotes disciplined and systematic study of the Old and New Testament Scriptures and aims to provide a deeper understanding thereby. The units include: The Pentateuch Writings; Israel's Conquest and life in Canaan; The Return of the Jewish Remnant from Exile; The Four Portraits of Christ's Life; The Principles of Christ's Doctrine; Christian Church History to A.D.325; The New Testament Epistles.

Degree in Biblical Theology

The recently launched course in biblical theology is run over four years to provide in-depth knowledge of the major doctrines of the Bible. Prior knowledge of the Bible is essential. The units include: Interpreting the Biblical Scriptures; What the Bible Teaches about God; The Biblical Concept of Salvation for Humankind; Christ and the Church; Biblical Account of the Future; Jewish Studies; Understanding the Hebrew Language of the Old Testament.

Study Tours

Study Tours to Bible lands are an essential part of the BIBS learning process; retracing the Exodus from Egypt via Mount Sinai to the holy land or Paul's footsteps on his missionary journeys to Europe and Asia.

HEALING FOR THE NATION

In just over four weeks I will be setting out on my medical elective to the other side of the world. After

much prayer, to which I must thank the BIBS prayer team, I have decided to go to Guyana and Papua New Guinea (PNG) for eight weeks. It wasn't an easy decision and was met with much discouragement and disbelief.

Most people who want to "help people" choose more common places like India and Africa. However I had a strong desire to go to PNG because the country was just as needy but hardly anybody goes there. The hospital to which I will be attached has one doctor, so there is much work for me to do. The hospital runs bush and river patrols to meet the needs of the communities that live alongside the Fly River.

Doing BIBS reminded me that it was when David was in the wilderness on the run from Saul that he was

prepared for the position God had called him to; and so this trip is likely to be an eye opener and life changing experience for me too.

Recently I completed a sponsored walk on the River Thames to raise money for my medical elective, people were taken aback that I was going to PNG. I am requesting your prayers for my trip; firstly that God will cover me as I go, secondly that I will be able to help with the

healthcare needs of the communities I meet when I am abroad. And most importantly that I will be used as a witness during my travels.

During my foundation year of BIBS I loved our study of the book of Joshua, so much so that the scripture I will take with me is, "Have I not commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage: be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest" Jos. 1: 9.

Early this year, I received a phone call from my son who told me that there was to be a retreat and that he wanted me to go. I was not to worry about the cost; he would take care of it. On the 14th March he sent me a text message saying, "Make sure to book time off. It's important for you to go".

By this time I was full of fear and self doubt, why oh why had I agreed to go? I wouldn't know anyone or what to expect. I searched my mind for an excuse not to go and then I remembered that I would be called in to hospital for surgery on my right knee. The hospital set the date for my operation, Friday 10th April. I still went in but was sent home as I was not well enough to have a general anesthetic.

The retreat was such a blessing. I have never experienced such joy in the Lord. I spent three days in total praise and worship to Christ my king and I didn't want it to end. It was a time of deep self examination and it required honesty, especially as I listened to the teachings on

'Suffering', 'Overcoming Fear' and 'Strongholds'. I had to deal with strongholds that I didn't even know had me bound. I needed to be set free and I couldn't worship God unless I identified my strongholds. I asked the Lord to help me. I prayed, "search me O Lord..." I had to mash down some walls. I went to the retreat cast down and found my deliverance. I sought the Lord and he heard me.



Integrity

"I believe that integrity is seen and not heard. It professes loudly about who we are, it characterises us and is the most essential attribute of the righteous."

Sis Paulette went on to say, "Not long ago my own integrity was called into question, this resulted in me being suspended for a short period of time. My prayer was that my integrity and uprightness would protect me. Accusations were brought against me but God was with me. Instead of dismissal I was reinstated. In all of this I refused to sin with my lips, I would not lie and was determined to hold on to my integrity and would not let it go. My integrity saw me through."

Commitment

"Committed means -'I give'. It is a personal commitment to give

yourself to a person or thing. It is the willingness to work hard and to give 100% energy and time, sweat or blood to a job or activity. Jesus then is the ultimate example of commitment... his commitment on earth was to give his life that we might live. Jesus hung in complete commitment, even unto the death of the cross. My commitment to God must then be tested; unless it is tested commitment is worth nothing. It's going to cause me to sweat, it's going to cause me to bleed sometimes but my commitment MUST remain true. Commitment requires responsibility. Bro Marlon ended by saying, "the question is... are we committed to Christ or to the world?"

The explanation is in the word itself. Faith in

its most general terms means assurance, belief, persuasion and Trust. If I have faith in you, I trust that you will be loyal, dependable, trustworthy and full of integrity. Now fullness is completion; not only do I trust you to be loyal, dependable and trustworthy but it must be to completion. I trust you not just to do it in part but in whole.

Christ was so faithful in his work that the completion took preeminence over his feelings. We have a wonderful example in Jesus of how to endure hardship; he suffered to completion saying, "It is finished". Sis Jade ended by saying. "The mentality of one who is faithful must be unto completion. Faithfulness has no day off, no lieu day..."

I stand before you today and proudly announce to this congregation that it takes 168 hrs of academic study for a BA degree; 128hrs plus 32 hrs and an

assignment for a masters degree. It takes the pre –requisite studies plus 32 hours and a dissertation to obtain a doctorate. Today we present to you an earned, not an honorary PHD".

The congregation was ecstatic, amidst the standing ovations were tears and shouts of joy. The entire room acknowledged that Bishop Dunn had earned this qualification for over 50 years of relentless work in this great ministry.

The message was clear, Bishop had served God faithfully with all his heart, soul and strength... He had evangelised, established churches, led the Bethel organisation, taught & preached in different countries crossed national and geographical boundaries, wrote books, gave counsel, and trained the elders. Being fully committed to the faith of the fathers he gave all with no thought of reward.



THE STAGE IS SET FOR A ONE WORLD RELIGION!





















Over the past decade we have seen a resurgence of interfaith movements...

In August 2000 Kofi Anan, addressed over a thousand religious leaders gathered in New York for the United Nations (UN) Millennium World Peace Summit of Religious and Spiritual Leaders. Mr Anan said, "Of course, the practice of religion differs widely, But at heart we are dealing in universal values. To be merciful: to be tolerant, to love thy neighbour; no religion can claim a monopoly on such teachings". He went on to say that the UN was an instrument of faith, inspired by what unites the great religions of the world.

It was the first time in history that all the major religions (Buddhism, Christianity, Islam, Judaism, Shinto, Confucianism, Hinduism etc) and spiritual traditions opened dialogue for interfaith cooperation. The goal of the summit was to find a way they could work together on peace, poverty and environmental issues.

This summit ushered in a new era of collaboration amongst leaders of diverse faiths and the UN. Not only did the leaders sign a commitment to global peace but shortly after that they formed -The World Council of Religious

Leaders, "an interfaith ally" to support the UN its aim for global peace and security.

The Council, made up of religious leaders from the UN member states, has created its own laws and constitution; forged links with the World Bank, major businesses, governments and unions in its drive to promote peace, religious tolerance and the eradication of poverty. Sounds good?

It's not, we are being

2 Thess 2:4.

deceived... For many the ecumenical movement appears on the face of it, to be a good thing; bringing peace, tolerance and even unity of the faiths but when you take the lid off, what really lurks behind it all is the work of Satan. Rev 13:11-18, speaks of one who will have the appearance of a lamb; a powerful speaker who (in the second half of Daniels' week) will usher in a world religion and cause the beast to be worshipped by all on the earth. Rev 13:8 & 12-18, Dan 8:25: 11:36-45:

The summit and advisory council in unifying the faiths on key values have provided a door, even set the stage for a one world religion, all under the guise of PEACE.

Ah! Your thinking the book of revelation points to a later time... YOU ARE WRONG.

The mystery of iniquity does already work, 2 Thess 2:7. What prevents the revelation of the man of perdition, (the anti Christ himself), is the church. Once we are taken away, all will be revealed. For now it's the spirit of the anti-Christ that's at work, I Jn 4:3. It is so subtle you could almost miss it...



Still not convinced?

Then answer these questions. Why has all the attempts to bring faiths, religions and spiritual traditions together centred on common values e.g. tolerance, compassion? Why do they seek to establish an alternative basis for interpreting scriptures?

Tony Blair's Faith Foundation, set up in 2006, suggests mutual values of respect, justice and compassion. He has set up several interfaith activities, including a 'Face to Faith' online community for school children across the world, with resources and training for teachers; and a faith and globalisation programme with leading research universities. Some strongly argue that the charity's goals can't be realised without, "... the imposition of a politically correct interpretation of sacred Scriptures..."

More recently, Karen Armstrong a former nun had her wish granted by the TED (technology entertainment and design) organisation for the development and propagation of a Charter of Compassion. It is crafted by thinkers from the three Abrahamic traditions Judiasm, Islam and Christianity and based on the golden rule of Confucius which is 'do not do to others that which you would not like them to do to you'.

The Charter will:

- Introduce core ideas (values) of compassion and the golden rule
- Suggest actions to "bring these ideas into the world more fully".
- Give guidelines on how to interpret the scriptures.

The Charter will be signed off later this year and circulated to institutions, schools and made available through the internet. "It will change the conversation around religion... shift concepts of religion for all people...

with the goal of building a harmonious global community". A clarion call to all.

Karen will be working with the UN's Alliance of World Civilisation (AWC), who since 2005, has been focusing on unifying initiatives in the areas of youth, media and education. AWC activities include: the development of teaching materials, training trainers, learning spaces and knowledge exchanges with universities.

These organisations all have major financial and media backing. They are targeting our youth, through websites, and education programmes. PARENTS BE AWARE, don't rely on religious education at school, we must teach our children the FAITH... Deut. 6:7. Values won't save our youth but belief in Christ will, Jn. 3:16.

For Karen, belief in Christ is secondary to compassion and the golden rule. She said, "If religion is not about believing things, what is it about? ...Religion is about behaving differently..."

Answer this, dear reader?

Why have the interfaith movements clearly omitted any reference to Jesus Christ or salvation through belief in him?

The bible declares that **Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life,** no man comes unto the father but by him Jn. 14:6. If you take Jesus out of the equation you remove TRUTH.

If you take belief in Christ out of the equation, man remains dead in his sin, bound to Satan. Think about it... why would God bring together all world religions in an interfaith movement that denies, even silences his name and prevents belief in Christ for the hope of eternal life. That's not God but Satan; he is deceiving men with a strong delusion, yes those who would rather believe a lie, 2 Thess 2:1-13; 1 Jn 2:18-22.

If all of that doesn't get you to think, then consider this advert?

The book of Revelation, Daniel and 2 Thessalonians in the Bible, clearly speaks of the anti Christ;




The Lamb with Two Horns, Rev 13: 11

JESUS IS THE ANSWER

God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son (to the world) that whosoever believeth (relies on, trusts in) in him should not perish but have everlasting life' (John 3:16). These re-assuring words were spoken by Jesus himself, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

The problems in the world today exist because solutions are being sought outside of Jesus, the only answer to every situation. However those who believe in Jesus are complete in him and knows that their help comes from the Lord.

In the beginning the sovereign, selfexisting, absolutely holy God created human beings in his moral image and likeness that we could have a relationship with him. However Adam, the first man and head of the human race, rebelled (transgressed) against God and unwittingly sided with Satan in his bid to be like God.

The Bible says that 'the wages of sin is death'. Adam's rebellion therefore resulted in him being alienated from God, and the beautiful relationship he had with him, and was subjected

to a life under the influence of Satan. His nature was also tainted with sin.

All human beings, descendants of Adam, are subsequently born with a sinful nature (character, heart) that has the inbuilt tendency to do wicked works i.e. cruelty to others and selfishness and subjected to the influence of Satan, the prince of the power of the air (Ephesians 2:1-2).

Seeking to please and depend upon our creator was no longer natural to human beings. Instead we seek to find solutions to our problems in ourselves rather than in the one who made us and upholds all things by the Word of his power.

Nevertheless the God of love looked beyond our faults and saw our need for deliverance from our sinful state. We were held captive to sin like a slave, with no-one willing or able to buy us our freedom. We had angered the Most High God and his anger needed to be appeased; Sin left us in debt to God that we could not repay; We were found guilty and condemned to death (the soul that sinneth, it shall die); We needed our

sins to be forgiven and only God can forgive sins. We were in a great strait and needed someone with the power to deliver us from our hopeless state; this was beyond what any human being could accomplish; only God could deliver us.

The price was high; above what humankind was able to pay; not corruptible things such as silver or gold, but untainted blood that had power to satisfy all the above needs. Some-one had to die on behalf of all humankind.

In his grace God sent his only begotten son (Jesus Christ) in the likeness of sinful flesh to deliver human beings from their state of hopelessness. Jesus' blood had the necessary power to redeem us from sin and appease God's wrath, so he took upon himself all our sins and gave his life as a ransom for us; he was buried and three days later he rose again and is now seated on high making intercession for those who believe in him. This is the gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ.

Jesus has purchased our salvation with his own blood. This salvation is not only wrought to rectify the misdeeds done in the past but also our sinful nature.

Now that God has made provision for all human beings to be saved, every individual must choose Jesus to be restored to the moral image of God and eternal life with him or choose to pay the full penalty for sin, which is eternal damnation.



What do you have to do to accept Jesus as your personal saviour and Lord?

Turn from your sins and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ; Be baptized in water in the name of Jesus (to identify with the death and burial of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ) for the forgiveness of your sins; If you truly believe in him you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in you, to transform you into the image of Jesus, and to baptize you into the body of Christ, the Church. All members of the body are united in Christ, the head of the body. As in the first Adam all died even so in Christ, the last Adam, all who are in him are made alive (1 Cor. 15: 21-22).

Human beings need to be regenerated with a new heart, spirit and mind; In Christ only can we have universal peace. Compassion is an outward manifestation of those who have been baptised into Christ and have the nature of Christ working in them.

No creature can bring peace into this world or unite it except Jesus, the creator of all things; He is our Peace; he upholds all things by the word of his power (Heb 1:3); he holds all things together (Col. 1:17).

Paul, in his epistle to the Roman Christians, who associated power with the Roman Empire, wrote: The gospel of Jesus Christ is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth for therein is the righteousness of God revealed, from faith to faith; as it is written, the just shall live by faith' (Rom. 1:16-17).

Do not be deceived into believing another gospel apart from the gospel of Jesus Christ. In their aim to promote world peace they are perverting the gospel of Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul told the Church in Galatia that even if an angel from heaven preaches another gospel, which is not the gospel of Jesus Christ, let him be accursed (Gal. 1: 6-9).

Be not dismayed, God is still in control of the universe. All these things must come to pass before the end comes. In the meantime seek the Lord Jesus while he may be found; call upon him while he is near.

Today, if you hear the voice of the Lord bidding you to come to him through this article, harden not your heart.
