

Courses on Offer 2013/14

Enrolment

10.00am - the door slides open, our first set of students have arrived. By 11.00am the room is buzzing and there's a real sense of excitement in the air as people of different ages and from all walks of life introduce themselves, talk about the courses and exchange stories about their divine call to BIBS.

2.30pm - Afternoon classes are really interactive and fun; students take part in group work, lively debates and even role plays. Under the anointing, teachers expound the true doctrine and open up their understanding. One student described their encounter below:

"My most profound encounter was whilst studying 1 Samuel; the people wanted a King like the other nations and God told Samuel that they had not rejected Samuel but Him. I felt washed by the Word and a whole new conviction came upon me."

I asked God to forgive me if I had ever rejected Him and for help to recognise the things I could choose over Him. I cried for days; the words would not leave me; it was as if I had never read them before. It's a privilege to search the scriptures at BIBS;


it is truly life changing."

Did you know?

The Revival of the Roman Church...

Did you know that the Pope claims to be the supreme head of all Churches on earth? Also, that the new Pope, Francis I is an ex- Provincial Superior of the Jesuit order of Roman Catholic Priests? Did you know lightning hit the Vatican twice, hours after Pope Benedict XVI resigned?

The ethos of the Jesuit order is to uphold the beliefs, rites and ceremonies of the original Roman Church. It's only been four months since Pope Francis was installed and he is already reviving the traditions of the original Roman Church; beliefs for which he is already well known.

The Guardian read: "Vatican offers 'time off purgatory' (a state or place of spiritual cleansing after death) to followers of Pope Francis Tweets"- July 17. The story

referred to the Vatican's offering of 'indulgences' (forgiveness of sins to reduce the time a catholic will have to spend in purgatory), if you follow the Pope on twitter during Catholic World Youth Day.

With the help of the Vatican penitentiary court, that handles forgiveness of sins, Pope Francis has used social media to revive this age-old unbiblical rite into the 21st century: subtly reinforcing the Roman Church as mediator between God and Man and the

only means by which forgiveness for sins may be obtained.

The papacy's offering of indulgencies negates Christ's work on the cross, as the Bible clearly teaches that there is one mediator, the man Christ Jesus, who died that our sins may be forgiven: without which men remain in their sins and their souls totally lost.

It's interesting, that on one hand Pope Francis is the greatest defender of the poor; the voice of conscience that forges

global networks to provide food programs; the one who fights strongly against social injustice, abortion, same sex marriages and homosexuality; whilst on the other hand, as a Jesuit he "steely" advocates beliefs that block men from having direct access to Jesus and true forgiveness through His shed blood. Col. 1:14; Ro.5:2.

Under his papacy men may not die of starvation but they will not escape eternal death, as they are yet in their sins.

In the Pope's attempts to grow the international inter-religious community, another aim of the Jesuit order, he has extended his hand to Jews, Muslims, Buddhists and the daughter Churches who broke away in protest against the rites, sacraments and ceremonies of the Roman Church and priesthood.

During a morning mass in May, he reached out to Atheists, implying that by doing good, they too are redeemed. This shocked many! Well, the Bible clearly teaches that to be redeemed you must have faith in Jesus, the TRUTH and the Way to eternal life: No amount of good that a man does can save his soul. Heb.11:6, 1 Jn. 1:9, Eph 2:8.

With a Jesuit Pope, the Jesuits now have direct links into the papacy. They

may no longer be using military might to preserve their beliefs but their modern weapons are just as powerful. Jesuits have a formidable army of lay educators instilling their unbiblical teachings into over 2.5 million students worldwide. Polluted with the doctrine of men during their early years, students are alienated from Jesus, the absolute Truth and eternal life.

As in the Days of Lot...

The last five years have seen a rapid acceleration in public support for same sex marriages and their adoption of children. What was once considered to be unthinkable is now widely accepted by governments, Churches and society and is gaining momentum throughout the world. A recent poll of 16 countries by IPSOS Mori (on behalf of Reuters News) shows:

"Seven in ten (73%) of those in 16 countries support some form of legal recognition of same-sex couples – 52% support full marriage equality and 21% support some form of legal recognition but not marriage."

Nine countries show outright majorities in support for full marriage equality: six where it is now legal and three where it is not yet legal (Germany, Great Britain, and Australia)." 65% of Britons agree that same sex couples should have the same rights to adopt children as heterosexual couples.

In 2005, the UK saw the doors open for same sex couples to adopt children; a few years later the government allowed Churches to host civil partnerships ceremonies and Christian establishments were fined for discriminating against gay couples. More recently, David Cameron (PM) has been campaigning hard for

the 'Marriage Bill' to be passed in Parliament, having gained strong public support; according to the Ipsos MORI poll – 'Freedom to Marry', "Around three quarters (73%) of British adults think gay people should be allowed to get married to each other while a quarter (24%) do not want to allow gay marriage."



Just last month, Paris became the 14th country to legalise gay marriages and the US Supreme Court of Justice ruled that "... same sex married couples must be treated the same as other spouses under federal laws governing tax, health care, pensions and other federal benefits."

So, why the accelerated pace?

Through the power of the media i.e. sitcoms, comedies designed to make us laugh and soaps depicting everyday life, the message that homosexuality is the 'norm' has been planted in the viewers subconscious. It's

so subtly, that without even realizing it, society has come to accept homosexuality as a way of life. It wasn't so long ago that homosexual scenes could not be shown on main stream TV but it's now a part of prime time viewing. Little by little we are becoming acclimatized to a lifestyle that the Bible refers to as an abomination or a sin. Lev 18:22-23; I Tim.1: 9, 10.

Dear reader, from the beginning it was God who ordained marriage between a man and a woman, a holy union that symbolizes Jesus' relationship with his Church. Eph. 5:24 -33.

When you consider the times we live in, you can only conclude that the coming of the Lord is nearer than we think! Don't allow yourself to be conformed to this world and its doctrines.

You may well ask; is anyone excluded from salvation by God's grace? No, dear reader, anyone who receives Jesus as their personal savior will be saved: *"And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God."* 1 Cor. 6:11.

L. Richards put it like this, "No person is beyond the reach of God's transforming Grace."

Jesus, the TRUTH and the way



Who is Jesus?

Jesus is God tabernacled in human flesh for the purpose of redeeming humankind from the bondage of sin and death. He created all things and by Him all things consist. He is also the head of the Church.

Why do we need redeeming?

As a result of Adam's transgression, the first human, sin entered the world and death entered also because of sin. Since then, every member of the human race is born in sin and with a sinful nature. Now the wages of sin is death; therefore the sentence of death was passed upon all human beings because all have sinned, in Adam, and needs to be redeemed from the bondage of sin. Adam's sin also alienated him and his descendants from direct fellowship with God.

How may we be redeemed and reconciled to God?

Jesus paid the price of your redemption with his shed blood when he took the sentence of death upon himself and laid down his life in our stead. Having completed His work of redemption Jesus returned to his Father and sent the Holy Spirit in His name to convince the world of sin. Those who believe in Jesus and receive Him as their personal saviour will be saved. Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no man cometh to the Father but by me" (Jn 14:6).

Jesus, the Truth

The definite article 'the' indicates; not a truth or one of the many truths but 'the' Truth; the only Truth whereby we are being sanctified. So what is Truth? In Jesus' prayer, He tells us that the Truth is the Word of God (John 17:17). The Gospel of John (1:1; 14) identifies this Word as God and further states that this Word was made flesh: so Jesus is God's revealed message, which is the Living Word.

This Truth is objective as it is not subjected to the influence of human opinions, culture, experiences or feelings; therefore one cannot manipulate this Truth to suit his or her situation: this Truth is reality, for Jesus came in the volume of the book, as it is written (Hebrews 10:5-7). So what truth is revealed in His Word?

It is the truth of Jesus being that ultimate Sacrifice for humankind's salvation, through His death, burial and resurrection; whereby He dealt with the sin nature that alienated humankind from God. Jesus is the embodiment of truth: God's full and complete message to all humankind which is the Good News; the power of God unto our salvation (Romans 1:16): for it is by obeying the Word that the soul is converted and purified (1 Peter 1:22). Furthermore, in the truth of God's Word is the ability to re-gene the sin-damaged gene of humankind; resulting in godly living that bears witness to the Truth.

Those who believe the Word and act upon it become sons of God, crying Abba, Father; which signifies that close, beautiful relationship of a father to a child as in Daddy.

*"And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."
John 8:32*

Jesus, the Way

As Jesus is the Truth so is He the Way back to God; The definite article 'the' in this declaration is noteworthy, as it implies; not a way or one of the many ways but 'the' way; the only way. It exclusively spells out to us that Jesus is the only way back to the Father and therefore brings home the truth that there exists no other path or entrance that can or will lead us to God except through Jesus Christ.

Let us consider the statement '...no man cometh unto the Father but by me'; the word 'cometh' speaks of 'moving toward the place' and 'unto the one' who is giving the direction. So, is there an expectation for humankind to come to the Father? Most definitely; the first man and woman were created in the image and likeness of God and once enjoyed fellowship with Him but sadly this relationship was severed when they sinned against God's command (Genesis 1- 3); so all Adam's descendants inherited his sinful nature and were also alienated from God.

However, God our Father loved humankind so much that He sent Jesus as the solution to the sin problem that robbed humankind from fellowship with Him... (John 3:16). All things concerning our salvation are in Jesus, for example: forgiveness of sins, reconciliation and restored fellowship with God our Father that will enable humankind to be fully reunited in complete fellowship with God.


It is therefore crucial that we receive and follow Jesus, God's prescribed way, instead of searching endlessly for a way that seems right to us i.e. man made religion. God by His Spirit was in Christ reconciling the world unto Himself...(2 Corinthians 5:19).

The Entreaty

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is still relevant to every culture, language and nation and whether He is believed or doubted, received or rejected, loved or hated, does not affect who Jesus is: God's Good News to humankind. Jesus is the Way back to God as well as the Truth to be believed, received and obeyed, every day all the way, for full effect.

Why not come to Jesus, the Way and the Truth? Forthrightly everyday, all those who believe the gospel, forsake sin, and are baptised in the name of Jesus, receive forgiveness of their sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit; they are immediately reconciled to God, to enjoy sweet fellowship with Him, and adopted into the royal family of God with full inheritance rights as a son and joint-heir with Jesus: thereby endowed with the right to call God, 'Abba, Father' (Daddy)!
