



BIBS: A Minist

We give God thanks for the life and ministry of our Presiding Bishop, Sydney Alexander Dunn who, 60 years ago, obeyed the heavenly calling and established the Bethel United Church of Jesus Christ Apostolic, here in the UK. Not only did he plant over 40 churches and establish elders to feed the flock of Christ but as a founding father he saw the need not just to build edifices but to build a people of power, grounded in the Word of God, through the Bethel Institute of Biblical Studies (BIBS).



We cannot say when the vision of a dedicated school of ministry was conceived in his heart but we do know, thank God, that the Bethel Institute of Biblical Studies was birthed. Our Presiding Bishop, appointed Bishop Martin Howard Simmonds as the first Principal of the Bible College based at the Bethel Convention Centre, Kelvin Way.

Setting up the school was no mean feat. Bishop Simmonds, along with his dedicated team set about their God given assignment; they worked tirelessly and relentlessly to turn the vision into a reality i.e. develop the curriculum, set up the all-important administrative systems, appoint the gifted and anointed teachers and seek out the very first students.

This Bethel ministry opened its doors for the first time on a Friday evening in September 1994, with teachers from across the country! This was a great achievement and delivered a severe blow to satan's Kingdom. Twenty years on and BIBS is still edifying the Body of Christ and equipping souls for life and ministry.

During his six years as Principal, Bishop Simmonds served faithfully and fervently: journeying hundreds of miles, experiencing many late nights and long days to ensure the College continued to strive for excellence. Even when he passed the baton on to Dr. Taylor in 2000, he continued to teach at BIBS and travelled with us on several student tours to Bible lands. Thank you for giving your all, to further the kingdom of God.

Dr. Taylor, our current Dean of Studies served with Bishop Simmonds from the inception, she was

dedicated and worked tirelessly alongside him to establish this ministry. She was indeed God's choice to take BIBS forward. Every teacher in the room agreed with the Board's appointment that day, we all gave a unanimous 'YES' to working with her; it was indeed an honour and still is. With her prayer team firmly in place, obeying and trusting God to the letter, Dr. Taylor went about her father's business.

From the time the prophecy went forth at our 1999 Graduation ceremony; "lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes", BIBS has gone from strength to strength. Under the leadership of Dr. Taylor, our current Dean (2000-2015), we have seen phenomenal growth:

- We have grown the number of classes and places available in BIBS. In 1994 we started with one class, then came two (the certificate 2-year course), then as directed by the Lord, our Dean added the Foundation, Degree and now the Short Courses.
- We have grown our outreach. Students now attend BIBS from all walks of life, different cultures and denominations, seeking and obtaining life. Having received the Word of life, many were convicted and subsequently baptised in the name of 'Jesus'.
- We have grown as a college to truly reflect the Body of Christ. We have students and teachers from different Christian organisations: we are workers together with Christ. We first welcomed Overseer Keith Linton from Beulah Apostolic Church, to our teaching staff in 2004.

The highlight of our twenty-year ministry was the awarding of our first earned PhD in 2009. It was a day to remember, our presiding Bishop Sydney Alexander Dunn received his Doctorate during the graduation ceremony. Dr. Nelson (Parkersburg USA), had hardly finished speaking before the congregation rose to their feet in rapturous applause; tears of joy flowed; ah! Such joy resounded across

the room. The applause was an acknowledgment of the effective preaching, teaching, and counseling ministry of Bishop Dunn. In graduation (2012), our hearts were once again filled with joy when Bishop Martin Simmonds and our Dean of Studies, Dr. Mavis Taylor were also awarded an earned PhD's in Biblical Theology, Christian Education. Counselling, Administration and



- We have grown in our knowledge and understanding of the Word. We have delved deeper into the Scriptures; our students can now study up to degree level.
- We have grown as an academic institute; working with Parkersburg Bible College (USA) and NOCN (UK); we received accreditation for our courses in 2008 and in 2011 became a 'Recognised Centre". We have also hosted Bible conferences, study tours to bible lands and countryside retreats.
- We have grown as a team. Our students that graduated from BIBS with distinctions were invited to join our teaching staff, after undergoing our stringent two-year mentoring program. All our Administrators are also past students.

Philosophy. Some of our teachers were also awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Theology; this strengthened the academic base of BIBS.

Bethel truly has much to celebrate in this 60th year of ministry, we thank God that as a ministry of Bethel, the Bible College has fulfilled its mandate and will continue to do so by the grace of God.

The Lukewarm Church

Many are concerned today about the spiritual condition of the Church, wondering when and how we got into this lukewarm state. Well, to understand our Church age, we need look no further than the seven Churches of Asia in the book of Revelation. The apostle John wrote several letters to them in AD90; each letter revealed the Church's true condition, a rebuke or commendation from Christ for their works and His promise to reward all those who overcame (Rev. 3). Although the Churches in Asia Minor no longer exist, theologians believe that they represent the seven Church ages.

Laodicea, the seventh Church of Asia, is said to be prophetic of the last and final state of the universal Church, which concludes with the rapture. It grieves my heart to say it but we are living in the last Church age; the lukewarm condition i.e. the spirit of indifference and complacency that led to Laodicea's demise, is the same spirit that pervades the Church today (Rev. 3:14-22).

So what do we mean by indifference and complacency?

To be indifferent, is to lack concern and interest. It's a state of apathy, where nothing matters. Indifference is dangerous because it breeds selfishness, self-centredness and leads to inactivity. To be complacent is to be self-satisfied, to be in need of nothing. This is disastrous as contentment with one's accomplishments leads to stagnation.

In what way are we lukewarm?

Although God has given great power and authority to the Church on earth, we are not exercising it: the voice of the Church (although universal) is seldom heard; we keep silent on the religious issues

that affect our world. We sit by and watch governments push through policies and laws that are an affront to God e.g. the Abortion bill, widening adoption rights, the legalisation of same-sex marriages. We are reluctant to get involved, to challenge these laws, even to pray as directed in Scripture for those in authority (I Tim. 2:2).

We appear to be unconcerned about the hundreds of thousands being persecuted and suffering daily in foreign lands for the name of Jesus. They need our prayers and financial support. Afraid of reprisals from religious organisations and political regimes, we distance ourselves from their plight.

We are oblivious to the needs of the precious souls around us. We remain unstirred, despite the homelessness and severe poverty; yes, right here in the UK, over one million families rely on food banks to feed their children. So many in our society are depressed, oppressed and suicidal but we "pass by on the other side." (Luk.10:32); we go about our daily business without a care. We've become ineffective in our local communities.

The Church is no longer purpose driven. The zeal that burned within us has fizzled out; that immediacy to take the world by storm and the love that compelled us to bring the gospel message to all has waned. Because the Early Church believed that the coming of the Lord was imminent, they moved with urgency to rescue the perishing but with the passing of time this dynamism has been replaced by apathy. Although we know the terror and fate that awaits the sinner, we remain unmoved.

So what caused our Lukewarm Condition?

Could it be that our blessings have overtaken us, and we have become self-satisfied? The 21st century Church has accomplished much: great edifices, congregations, ministries, and titles. We too, like Laodicea, believe we are in need of nothing but we are so

Could it be that we have compromised with sin? We have adjusted to this world; put down roots and are no longer pilgrims and sojourners. The Church doesn't have a problem with sin anymore; for



many Christians "it's not a heaven or hell issue"; we not only accept homosexuality as a 'norm' but we are reluctant to speak out as this can offend our friends.

Could it be that we are finding our purpose and fulfilment in everything else except the Church, the Body of Christ? Members sit in the congregation unfulfilled and disengaged. Their gifts which God gave to them to edify His Body lie dormant.

Could it be that we have replaced the knowledge of God and His Word with the paraphernalia of a well-organised Church? Order, professionalism and songs that move our emotions but do not minister to our spirits, wow many; even the preaching and teaching of the pure unadulterated Word of God is now minimised.

So how do we deal with Indifference and Complacency?

The answer may be found in the words of Christ to the Church in Laodicea:

Be zealous: The word zealous is derived from the Greek word


'zeo', which means to be hot (as in boiling liquid). It points to being fervent, passionate, serving the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and strength.

To Repent: The Church, must acknowledge its true condition, agree with God's right assessment of it; turn again to God and amend its ways.

The early Church started with only a handful of men and women; within a few years they turned the world "upside down". They took the Gospel into the world, crossing geographical, cultural and religious lines: they were passionate, zealous, and relentless.

They fearlessly faced kings, world powers, challenged philosophers, and rebuked the licentious behaviour of the day. Laodicea had fallen from this first state, which is not surprising as Jesus was put out of His Church.

Today, Jesus is still patiently knocking, but the question is, will we let him back into **His Church?**



Did you Know?

Did you know that satan is using the world systems to lure you into worshipping him?

Tell me more...

Satan, who was referred to as lucifer in creation, was the anointed cherub of God. His beauty and brightness outshone the entire angelic host; he was covered with every jewel possible: rubies, diamonds, onyx, etc. He walked amongst the glories (fire) of God, UNTIL the day iniquity was found in him; satan's heart was lifted up in pride (self-worship).

Yes, he fell in love with his own beauty, turned from worshipping his creator and God to worshipping himself; he even influenced a third of the angelic host to worship him (Jude 1:6). That was still not enough; he wanted more (does that sound familiar? it's greed). His position wasn't sufficient, he said, "I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God...I will be like the Most High" (Isa. 14:12-14; Eze. 28:12-14).

The question is my dear reader, why did he so desperately want to be God? The answer is that satan wanted ALL of creation i.e. the heavens, the earth and everything in it to bow down and worship him. He did not



want riches or power; he had that already; he wanted the WORSHIP that belonged to God (covetousness). God cast satan and his angels out of Heaven and he immediately set about his mission to get all of creation to worship him; If he could enlist Adam then all of humankind and the creation would be plunged into darkness. All would bow down to him.

Did you know that satan recruits worshippers through deception? *Tell me more...*

Satan doesn't approach you or I directly; if he did we would instantly recognise him. He enlists the greatest influences in life i.e. the person or thing that he knows you would follow. Watch this! satan targeted Eve, as she could influence Adam.

He deceived her by promising that her "...eyes would be open...you will be as gods" Adam, the progenitor of humankind, listened to Eve and as a result the world was plunged into servitude to satan and sin.

When God sent forth His son to redeem fallen man, satan saw it as his ultimate opportunity to get humankind to worship him. This time he would directly challenge the Son of God. He went in for the KILL,

The Persecuted Church

"Christians: the world's most persecuted people."

Since its birth, over 2,000 years ago, the Church has endured and overcome great persecution.


"The Way", as the Early Church was known then, was not accepted as a 'religio licita' by the Romans and was held as a real threat to Judaism by its leaders. As a result they were beaten, mocked, threatened, imprisoned, crucified, and devoured by lions: yes killed for Christ's name sake. Just as Jesus had told them, they were martyred for their belief, "Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. (Mat. 24:9). "Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake." (Mat. 5:11)

Stephen, one of the seven deacons in the book of Acts, was the first to suffer martyrdom. His death was the catalyst for the spreading of the gospel, not only in Jerusalem but to the regions beyond (Acts. 8:1). As the Church expanded, so too did Saul's campaign; he zealously pursued and killed any Christian who refused to deny Christ. However, they continued to declare the gospel, to preach and baptise in the name of Jesus. (Act. 4:1-3). It was during this time of severe persecution that the Church flourished: the Word grew, multiplied and prevailed, and great grace was upon them all.

It was not just the unbelieving Jews but the Romans also that persecuted the Church. Under Emperors Nero and Domitian. Christians were thrown to wild animals, burned to death, sawn asunder and suffered the loss of all things. However nothing was able to separate them from the Love of God, in Christ Jesus. (Rom. 8:38-39)

Christians have been persecuted throughout the centuries; from Polycarp the Bishop of Smyrna to William Tyndale (1536) who brought us the English translation of the Bible. Many have been betrayed by friends and even burned at the stake for their faith.

2000 years later, and the persecution has not stopped; even now in the twenty-first century Christians are being killed for their faith. Today, Christians are the most persecuted group in the world. In fact there are over 50 countries in the world, where persecution for Christianity is either extreme or severe. (See map below)



In 2015, several newspapers reported an increase in persecution across the globe. The Centre for the Study of Global Christianity in the United States estimates that 100,000 Christians are being killed every year and 11 every hour. Those that have died for their faith, young and old, were beheaded, hacked or burnt to death. News reports tell of the 500 Christians hacked to death in India, and more recently in April 2015, 147 Christian students were singled out and killed in Kenya, and 30 men beheaded/shot in the head on a beach in Libya.

According to the 'Church in Need Report', 15 May 2015, Christians in Nigeria are facing great atrocities. 5,000 Catholics have been killed, 100,000 displaced, and 350 Churches left in ruins. Despite all of this, one displaced priest said, "The believer's faith is not shaken by the terror or snares of persecution, instead it purifies it, making it stronger and impenetrable."

Christians in the Middle East and other places such as Pakistan and Sudan are experiencing a growing surge of persecution against them. The Independent newspaper reported that a pregnant woman was put into prison in Sudan for marrying a Christian; thankfully she was eventually released with her eight month old baby. According to recent figures, there are 2.01 billion Christians worldwide and approximately 2 million suffer some form of persecution.

On Faith & Culture

Right across the globe Christians are facing anti-Christian attacks, social harassment, discrimination, rape (in front of family members), and imprisonment. In some places, their houses and Churches were burnt to the ground; they were told to "...convert to Islam, pay a tax or be executed" and had to flee for their lives. North Korea is where persecution is the most severe in the world, "An estimated 50,000 to 70,000 Christians suffer daily in North Korea's prison camps... If believers are discovered they have to serve a sentence in a re-education camp; Christians are sent to political labour camps, from which there is no release." – The World Watch list– www.Open-DoorsUSA.org

Let's bring it closer to home. Right here in the UK, Christians are being persecuted, it may not be on the same scale as in the Middle East but policies gradually are being put in place that marginalises our faith and restricts our religious freedom. We are also experiencing discrimination in the workplace. It's subtle but today's Christian is being forced to deny Christ by being politically correct and are unable to speak out

against behaviours, which the Bible clearly describes as an abomination. We are expected to lie, falsify information, and be economical with the truth.

In 2011, a Christian couple from Derby were not allowed to continue being foster parents because of their Christian views on homosexuality. The High Court judge agreed that homosexuality rights, "should take precedence" over that of Christianity. Although this is a different type of suffering, it is still discrimination against the Christian faith. Although Churches can opt out of marrying same sex couples it may not be long before it becomes an offence for Churches to refuse. The biblical principles on which the Christian faith is built are being challenged daily and every believer should be awakened to the strategies of the enemy.

Persecution is here and it will slowly but surely intensify. The question is, Are you prepared to go through? Will you remain faithful to God in the face of persecution? Jesus said to the Church in Smyrna, "Be thou faithful unto death... He that overcomes shall not be hurt by the second death" (Rev. 2:10-11).

These may be the last Christians of the Middle East unless we help.



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
