nity is essential for the body of Christ because it leads the world to believe in Jesus (Jn 17:21), our kinsman Redeemer. A Marriage Made in Heaven


Congratulations from all of us at BIBS to our firstyear certificate student brother Joshua Chandler, who took his marriage vows on Saturday 25th March 2017.



We are living in the 'latter days', a time when men are departing from the Faith: the Faith being the body of teachings of the Apostolic Church. It is the teaching of Christ to the Apostles, which they have since handed down to faithful men and women.

The spirit of 'Error' has become prevalent in Christendom because many are no longer enduring sound doctrine but giving heed to doctrines of devils and doctrines of men. One such doctrine of man, is Humanism i.e. a dangerous belief that one can live a fulfilling, good life without God or religion, relying purely on reason and humanity. The 2011 UK Census showed an increase in the population reporting 'No Religion' – from 14.8 per cent of the population in 2001 to 25.1 per cent in 2011. (Figure 1)

There is therefore a pressing need for all regenerated believers to come together and unite (bond, attain unanimity) in the Faith i.e. believe and practice the same teachings of the Apostles. In other words, there needs to be a "oneness of mind" in the doctrine of Christ.

When we all believe and practice the same doctrine, we will no longer be as: "...children tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine by the sleight (fraud) of men and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive" (Eph. 4:13-14). If we are to have a greater understanding of the effect and power that being unified in the Faith achieves, we need to start by looking at the life and ministry of the early Church.

They had all things in common i.e. they believed in and taught that there is **ONE God**, who was manifested in the flesh; our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ (1 Tim. 3:16); that He was the express image of the invisible God and in Him dwelt "...all the fullness of the Godhead bodily." (Col. 2:9)

They believed and taught that there is **ONE Faith** i.e. the Apostolic Faith that teaches the fundamentals of repentance from Dead Works; Faith towards God; Baptism in the name of Jesus; the infilling of the Holy

The spirit of 'Error' has become prevalent in Ghost (Acts 2:38; 8:14-17; 19:5-6); living a Holy Life; Christendom because many are no longer enduring sound doctrine but giving heed to doctrines of devils (Heb. 6:1-2).

They believed in and taught **ONE Baptism** i.e. baptism in the name of Jesus for the remission of sins. They exercised the power and the authority that came with the Name. In fact did all in the Name i.e. preached, healed the sick, raised the dead and performed many signs and wonders (Acts 3:6; 4:4, 29-31).

Such was the power of the Name that the authorities forbade the Apostles from speaking in the name of Jesus, but being unified in the Faith they ceased not to teach and preach Christ (Acts 5:38-40, 42), the only Name under heaven whereby man can be saved (Acts 4:12).

As the Church continued steadfastly in the Apostles' doctrine, they matured and grew, not just spiritually but numerically and geographically. Being unified in the Apostolic faith, they were not stagnant, complacent or wavering in their mission to go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature (Mark 16:15). Such was the power of their unified resolution, that they turned the world upside down. Towns and cities were won and souls were drawn to Christ (Acts 17:6; 16:20).

Their 'oneness of mind' in the doctrine, not only brought Christ to a dying world but it cemented their relationship. They communed together, prayed together and broke bread together. The body of regenerated believers were edified and built up on the Truth of the Word.


Children of God, it is so important for that same unity and Apostolic teachings to be demonstrated in the Body of Christ today. Whatever doctrine a Church believes, that doctrine will be taught and propagated universally, therefore it is important that we teach no other doctrine (1 Tim.1:10)

As the end times draw nearer, the Church must stand firm upon its foundations i.e. the unadulterated Apostolic doctrine. Jude warns us that in the last times certain men will creep in unawares, those "...who were before of old ordained to this condemnation, ungodly men, turning the grace of our God into lasciviousness, and denying the only Lord God, and our Lord Jesus Christ" (Jude 1:3-4). We must therefore earnestly contend for the Faith which was securely laid by Jesus Christ and the Apostles.

The world has unified in its efforts to destroy the Truth. The Truth of God's Word has become 'alien' to the political systems and social laws of our Land and has gone as far as being taken out of our classrooms. Therefore, it remains for the Apostolic Church to unite in the Faith, so that the world may know the Truth and the Truth set them free. Let us therefore, "... all speak the same thing and that there be no divisions amongst us, that we be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgement." (1 Cor. 1:10)

We must continue steadfastly in the Apostles' doctrine and fellowship and in prayers (Acts 2 v 42, 46) and dare to turn our communities, workplaces, colleges and schools upside down. Just like the Apostles and the early Church, we too have the authority of the name of Jesus. We have the Holy Spirit empowering us to witness and we have the Truth!

Beloved let us unite together in the Faith, "take heed... unto the doctrine, continue in them, for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee" (1 Tim. 4 v 16).

Did you know that the Trinity is not a biblical doctrine?

Search the scriptures, and you'll notice there is no mention of the word 'Trinity' in the Bible. No, not even once. Christ, the Apostles and the early Church did not teach it. The Trinity was developed over hundreds of years after Christ, as influential men polluted the Word of God by adding their ideas, beliefs and philosophies to Scripture.


What is the doctrine of the Trinity?

The Trinity is the belief in One God, who exists eternally in Three Divine Persons: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Each 'Person' is equal in power (co-equal), they have always existed and were never created (co-eternal) and they share the same divine essence (co-substantial i.e. 'made of the same stuff').

In short, the erroneous doctrine teaches: "There is One God, and He is Three Persons". In contrast, the Bible teaches that "...The LORD our God is one LORD" (Duet. 6:4). The Scriptures refer to God as the "Holy One" over 52 times, and God refers to Himself (in the singular) as "I the LORD" over 52 times. God said, "I am the LORD, and there is none else, there is no God beside me..." (Isa. 45:5).

Where did the Doctrine of the Trinity come from?

The Encyclopaedia Britannica (web edition, accessed Apr-17) states that: "Neither the word Trinity nor the explicit doctrine appears in the New Testament, nor did Jesus and His followers intend to contradict the Shema in the Hebrew Scriptures: 'Hear, O Israel: the LORD God is one Lord...' (Duet. 6:4)".



Roman Catholic theologians (D'Ambrosio, 2015), Pentecostal scholars (Bernard, 1997) and secular historians (Armstrong, 1999) all confirm this fact. Furthermore, the Apostles' successors from A.D. 95 to 155 did not teach the doctrine of the Trinity. Bishops Clement of Rome, Ignatius and Polycarp believed in One God and that Jesus was God manifest in the flesh (Weisser, 1981; Bernard, 1996).

The word 'trinitas' (Trinity) first appears c. A.D. 213, used by Tertullian of Carthage (Bernard, 1996). Tertullian is the first to speak of God as 'three persons in one substance' (Bernard, 1996). He admitted that most Christians rejected his new doctrine, seeing him as "a preacher of two gods and three gods" (Tertullian, Ante-Nicene Fathers, Book 3).

Tertullian was considered a heretic in his day, he was not a bishop, and his teaching on the Godhead was not authoritative. Ironically, his version of the Trinity wouldn't pass as orthodox by modern day Trinitarians. Tertullian denied that the Son was co-equal or co-eternal to the Father (Bernard, 1996; D'Ambrosio, 2015).

Tertullian's 'trinitas' was new to Christendom, but common to paganism (idol worship). Egyptian, Babylonian & Eastern religions all feature a trinity of some sort. Hinduism teaches their supreme god is a trinity: 'Trimutri Brahma' (Brahma, Shiva and Vishnu).

So, when did the Trinity belief become an 'Official' doctrine?

Before A.D. 300 Christianity was a marginalised religion however by A.D. 313, it became accepted within the Roman empire following the conversion of Emperor Constantine. In A.D. 318 a dispute about the Godhead threatened to tear Constantine's Empire apart. Christians went so far as to riot and come to blows with each other about their differences. The dispute began in Alexandria of Egypt but quickly spread throughout the Empire.

The dispute was between Alexander (Bishop of Alexandria) and one of his pastors Arius. Arius saw the Son as the first of God's creations, based on Hellenistic philosophy and a misinterpretation of Proverbs 8:22 (Dünzi, 2007). Alexander believed the Son eternally existed with the Father as a separate Person (Berkhoff, 2002). Both views were a departure from the Scripture.


Constantine inherited a divided Empire, he had successfully united it and could not afford to see it split again. Therefore, he summoned the first Ecclesiastical Council of the Roman church. It was at the Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325 that the Trinity became the official doctrine of the Roman church.

Tradition says 318 Bishops attended, but the truth is we don't know (Jones, 1997). However, many of the bishops from the West (Latin) didn't attend; they didn't realise how significant the meeting would be. Being more staunchly monotheistic in their view, they could have swayed the outcome. It was Constantine that suggested the idea of 'same substance.'

The Council of Nicaea didn't adequately define the Trinity in A.D. 325. It wasn't until 56 years later in A.D. 381 (after Constantine's death) that bishops gathered in Constantinople to expand the Nicene Creed (statement of faith) to include the Holy Spirit and His relation to the Father and the Son.

The Significance of the Nicaean Council

The Council developed a new doctrine that would affect how Christians thought and taught about God. It is based on unbiblical language: Eternal Son, eternally begotten, substance, persons etc. It would set a precedent for later Councils to create unbiblical doctrines such as purgatory, Mary worship etc.


At Nicaea, the Bishops gave their authority as leaders of the Roman church to the Emperor (a new convert) because of Constantine's position (Jones, 1997). Rather than stand for the Truth, they agreed to compromise. From Nicaea onwards, you could die for not accepting the Trinity. Following Nicaea Constantine ordered that any book written by Arius must be burned and anyone protecting his books faced the death penalty (Letter of Constantine, A.D. 333).

Today, of the 2.4 billion Christians in the world 99% hold to the Roman Catholic erroneous doctrine of the Trinity (Pew Research, Dec-2011).

According to the Encyclopaedia Britannica the Nicene Creed is accepted as authoritative by the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican and major Protestant Churches. Thus, the three largest branches of Christianity each recognise the Nicene Creed.

What will you believe the Truth or manmade beliefs?

Dear Reader, now that you know the origins of the doctrine of the Trinity what will you choose to believe about Jesus? Do you believe He is the second person of a man-made Trinity, or do you agree with the Word of God that states: "For in Him dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily" (Col. 2:9)? Jesus Christ is the "Everlasting Father" and the "Mighty God" (Isa. 9:6). He is Emmanuel, 'God with us' (Isa. 7:14, Mt. 1:23). Jesus Christ is the "Only Wise God our Saviour" (Jud. 1:25). He is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, the Almighty (Rev. 1:8). If you've wrestled with the idea of a Trinity and been confused by it, you need not anymore, for Jesus did not teach it, and the Apostles (early Church) did not preach it.
